SUPPLEMENTARY LOCAL RULES

Distance Measuring Devices-

A player may obtain distance information by use of a distance measuring device. Use of such a device to gauge other conditions (e.g. elevation changes) is a breach of **Rule 14-3**.

Water Hazards

Water hazards and lateral water hazards are marked with stakes and their margins are defined by yellow or red lines. In areas where there are no lines visible, the margins of the water hazards are defined by the mowing lines surrounding the water hazards. These lines are to be used in determining the reference point at which a ball enters the water hazard. Balls resting on or abutting these lines are deemed to be in the water hazard. Water hazard stakes are movable obstructions.

Naturalized Areas-

Areas defined by split rail fencing and all planted flower and shrub beds are deemed to be ground under repair from which play is prohibited. If a player's ball lies in the area, or it interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the player **must** take relief without penalty as prescribed in **Rule 25-1, by dropping his ball within one club length of his nearest point of relief, not closer to the hole**. Split rail fences are immovable obstructions.

Out of Bounds-

All boundary fences and areas marked with white stakes. The property line marked with white stakes to the left of the 9th hole is OB. The pond to the left of the 9th hole is OB and not a water hazard. Stakes on the left side of 5 indicate OB and the fence defines the OB. The white line on the asphalt path adjacent to the driving range on the left side of 18 defines OB.

Embedded Ball-

Through the green, a ball that is embedded in its own pitch-mark in the ground may be lifted, without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as possible to where it lay but not nearer the hole

Wrong Putting Green-

The practice green behind the 9th green is a wrong putting green and relief must be taken pursuant to **Rule 25-3**

Staked Trees-

If a staked tree, its stakes or supporting wires interferes with a player's stance or area of intended swing, relief without penalty must be taken pursuant to **Rule 24-2**

Drop Zones- (as additional options)

Holes 4 & 17 for a ball entering the lateral water hazard to the rear of the green only, there are two drop zones. Use the drop zone nearest to where your ball entered the hazard.

Hole 10 for a ball entering the lateral water hazard adjacent to the green there are two drop zones.

Doubt as to Procedure – If in doubt as to procedure and a rules official is not readily available, play a 2nd ball under Rule 3-3 and report to the committee before returning scorecard.
